This is Renton's 28th walk, and we have raised over \$462,000, with over \$115,000 helping Renton food agencies. Last year, we raised \$22,000. Our best year was \$34,000.

Chasing the Wild Goose

What a wonderful week we had - Holy Week and Easter! We began with the processional of ferns, ribbons and placards on Palm Sunday! As the hymn said, *we sang our loud Hosannas!* On Maundy Thursday we gathered for a meal of so many good soups to remember the meal of the command to love. Friday night some gathered with friends at Renton United Christian church to experience the passion of Jesus in a new way. Oh, and then there was the behind the scenes activities on Holy Saturday - folks spreading bark, chairs being moved, flowers set into place, banners being hung, Easter Eggs to be hidden, a cross to be flowered, last minute practicing of songs and signs, the music of piano, guitar, organ, flute and bells! Yes, and the noise of vacuum and Windex could also be heard. Then a triumphant Sunday! Rain held off until after the Sunrise service. What a day of celebration - overflowing with joy and exhalation.

And now...what? Easter can feel like the end. As is my tradition I went home to crash for a few days only to be greeted with much to do on Wednesday. The work is not over. Easter can't be an end but must be a beginning. In the fifty days of Easter (see you thought it was just a day!) we will explore the "now what?" In the days between Jesus' resurrection and ascension he continued to teach his disciples what discipleship really meant. In those days the disciples went from those few locked in a room afraid of the future to a multitude ready to live lives of transformation for the world.

Our statement of purpose as the United Methodist Church says we are to ***make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.*** I want us to really explore with those disciples of old what we 21st Century disciples must be and do in order to transform the world. I have no preconceived idea - rather a real curiosity of what it means for us at Fairwood to be "disciples" in our world today.

I do know we can no longer be disciples who lock doors out of fear - it is time for doors to be open wide so others might come in - and we might go out in new ways. So take this as an invitation to truly be an Easter people, disciples growing and becoming all God needs us to be.

Here is a bit more information about one of our largest budget items – Apportionments or Shared Ministries. As I mentioned in my previous article, our 2011 Conference Apportionments total \$51,096, or 14% of our budget, and are divided among six funds; World Service and Conference Benevolences Fund, Ministerial Support and Administration Fund, Pension and Benefit Fund, Ministerial Education and Black College Fund, District Fund and Africa University Fund. This month we will focus on Africa University fund. The following is from the www.umcsgiving.org. Additional information and student stories can also be found at this site.

We annually support the transformation of Africa by educating nearly 1,200 African students from 25 countries. We empower more than 3,500 graduates. We meet Africa's Vital Needs across the continent.

The Health Ministry Committee is offering various new health brochures and booklets in celebration of National Women's Health Week in May. Materials for women:

- ◆ A guide to staying healthy that encompasses health care recommendations for women starting at age 19. The booklet also includes general screening tests and immunizations recommended for all women and some additional tests specifically for women with high risk factors.

- ◆ A brochure that describes a government website offering health tips for girls ages 10-16. The brochure is written in English and Spanish.

Trustee Report

Thanks to all who so generously care for the details of
keeping our buildings and grounds ready for ministry.
Many see things that need cleaning or repairing and take
care of it, sometimes without trustees knowing about it. So
we give you thanks.

Thanks to our hard working work party volunteers:
Landscaping was readied for spring, as the weeds were
greatly diminished. Much was accomplished, so summer
maintenance should be easier.

Equipment purchases: The hot water heater in the MPR
building failed. Jerry Flagel and Don Andersen installed a
new one with Mas Yamamoto, Mary Marvin, and Tom
Foulds assisting with details. Nonfunctioning range hoods
were replaced thanks to Dave Bublitz and Don Andersen. A
new 16 inch commercial vacuum was purchased after the
old one quit.

Some other details include addressing the vandalism in the
mower shed and the installation of a new lock. Replacing
broken light covers, cleaning gutter boxes, servicing the
lawn mower, washing windows, cleaning the MPR kitchen
ranges, spraying the moss on the cover over the back patio,
maintaining rodent control, installing a speaker in room 2,
fixing the outside lock in room 7, updating fire exit
instructions, cleaning off the back patio, blowing off the
parking lots, mowing and edging the lawn, servicing our
phone system, cutting cottonwood log and replacing
nonfunctioning lights have been accomplished.

Work in Progress: Ten yards of beauty bark have been
donated, so thanks to Tom Foulds and a helpful crew, that
should be spread in time for Easter. The sweet gum trees
need to be removed as their roots are breaking up the
asphalt. We have received bids on that removal and stump
grinding, but are waiting for volunteers to move the plants
under them. Removal of dead plants along the back youth
room wall is needed to make room for the plants. Sharon
Hinton is working with the preschool in developing a
garden for children.

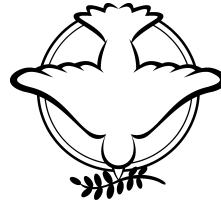

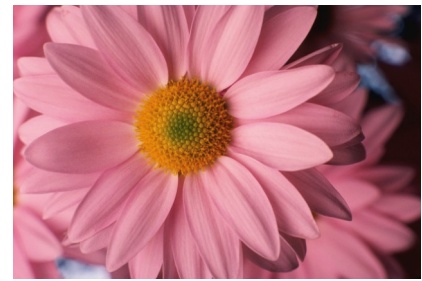
